

ICE AGE TRAIL COMMUNITY COMMITTEE MINUTES
TUESDAY, JULY 2, 2019
6:00 PM
BOARD ROOM, MUNICIPAL BUILDING, 210 COTTONWOOD AVENUE

Present: Christina Callies, Jim Muenzenberger, Jeff Romagna, Jeanie Georgson and Kelli Yogerst.

Excused: Dave Van De Ven, Dave Thiel

Meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm by Kelli Yogerst.

Motion (Callies/Romagna) to nominate Muenzenberger as interim-chairperson for tonight's meeting. Carried (6-0).

1. Consideration of a motion to approve the Minutes for the meeting of June 4, 2019.

Motion (Georgson /Callies) to approve the minutes of the IATC meeting of June 4, 2019 with the correction of Van De Ven being excused instead of present. Carried (5-0).

2. Discussion and consideration of:

a. Using pins for completion of the Hartland segment –

Yogerst said she emailed Shelly from Best Edge Marketing for the price and she said it is \$3.85 per pin with the minimum being 100 pins, so the total would be \$385 plus a set-up fee. Yogerst said with the magnets and the banner there is still \$913 remaining in the 2019 budget, and with the pins that would take the budget down to approx. \$500. There was discussion on luminary lights or flashlights for the trail hike.

Motion (Callies/ Romagna) to approve purchasing the pins and charging \$5 for them initially to recoup the cost. Carried (5-0).

b. Recreation programs with the Ice Age Trail Community Committee–

There was discussion on the September 28th Hike and whether to use luminary bags or flashlights. A bus will pick everyone up at Centennial and take them to Delafield and everyone will hike back to Centennial from there. It was decided to make the hike free and the event will be taken up from the General Fund.

Motion (Callies /Romagna) to approve the September 28th hike to be free and cost of bus will be taken from the General expense Fund. Carried (5-0).

c. . Final dates for walk and Moonlight Hike and how to promote events –

No charge for the event and Georgson will check with Lapham Peak about luminaries. There was discussion to limiting it to 50 people for the October Hike and if there would be hike leaders. There was also discussion on people being required to register to utilize the bus. The hike will be on October 12th with varied terrain.

d. Updates on Website-

This will be placed on the next agenda.

e. How to eradicate invasive species Japanese Knotweed and who should address it:

Yogerst said she forwarded this to the DPW. It was stated that the IATC considers it an issue since it is spreading along the Ice Age Trail Segment and would like it to be brought to the attention of Environmental Corridor and that the IATC doesn't have it in the budget and maybe grants could be used. Georgson said there are grants out there. It was discussed that this should be brought to the village board's attention and a plan should be developed.

3. Update on the Bark River clean-up project-

Discussion on allowing groups to take on small segments as they have been throughout the summer. DPW is interested in continuing with the project. Kiwanis is looking at having a larger fall event and at the next meeting setting dates. Discussion on clean up events.

4. Future meeting topics-

Muenzenberger asked if some things could go back to the way they were on the agenda and Yogerst said she would check if that could be done.

5. Announcements – Hartland Kids Day is coming up on July 31st, 2019 and there are volunteers needed for the IATC.

6. Adjourn – Motion (Yogerst/ Georgson) to adjourn. Carried (5-0).
